Has the Door to Fair Housing Been Slammed in Your Face?

Have you heard any of the following comments while looking for a place to live?

- “We don’t rent to more than three people for a two-bedroom apartment.”
- “You might not feel comfortable in this neighborhood.”
- “We don’t rent to families.”
- “You can’t build a ramp for access to the building — it won’t look good.”

If so, you may be the victim of housing discrimination.
